Thanks to a recent \$140,000 grant made possible by the state Department of Education and the Joshua Brown Foundation, the school has a teacher, an aide, and a driver ed curriculum in place.



There is already a waiting list of students to apply for the next 9-week session of classes, proving its popularity.

Teacher Tim Ellis says the class is long overdue at the high school, and he jumped at the chance to teach the course.

The class is free, includes classroom simulator work, highway driving and parental participation.
